

## Htin Lin was born in May, 1919 in Yay Oo, a small town in Upper Myanmar. His parents were U Hpo, a surveyor, and Daw Hla.

He was the second son among four siblings. He studied at the monastery at Nyaungle Village in Yay Oo township and continued studying in U Thar Gyan Middle School at Htantapin Zeegon (1919-20)

and in Yay Oo English- Myanmar Middle School (1930-1931) and in Shwebo PSG Missionary School (1931-39). He matriculated in 1939. He continued studying at Yangon University in 1947 and he had a B.A. degree and had an L.L.B degree in 1954.

He worked as a clerk at Shwebo Deputy Commissioner's Office from 1939 to 1947, as an assistant compiler at Burma Translation Society in 1948 and then as an assistant editor from 1949 to 1954. He transferred to work as an assistant editor at Universities' Translation and Publishing Department from 1954 to 1955.

He also taught English as a tutor at English Department of Yangon University from 1955 to 1959. He published Ngwetaryi Magazine and Malarmyaing journal as a founder and as an editor-in-chief for Ngwetaryi. He had taught English as

a private school teacher since 1963. He entered the literary world with a short story entitled 'Nelpaing Oakhtoke' (The District Commissioner's Hat) under the pen name of Thein (Ahnyar). He took the pseudonym of Htin Lin with a short story in Padaytha magazine in 1948. He translated Mahaythi (Marguerite De Valois) in 1953,

Myittashin Pollyana (Pollyana) in 1974, Mawgali (Mowgali) in 1974, and Paleit (The Plague) in 1974. He also wrote a novel "Return to Green Bosom" in 1975. This book is a collection of his articales written in English

that have never been published before.
