Foreward

by Dr Thant Myint-U

hura U Shwe Mann is a major figure in history of early 21st century Myanmar. The publication of this book should therefore be welcomed, not only by those interested in Myanmar's recent developments, but by anyone wanting to better understand transitions from military dictatorship.

Thura U Shwe Mann has been at the centre of Myanmar government and political life now for nearly two decades, first as a senior member of the army general staff, then as Speaker in the country's nascent parliament. As a former general who became a champion of democratic reform, his career reflects Myanmar's amazing and sometimes perplexing political journey these past years, its challenges, and potential.

This book is not only about Thura U Shwe Mann, but also, as the title suggests, about his groundbreaking partnership with State Counsellor Daw Aung San Suu Kyi.
